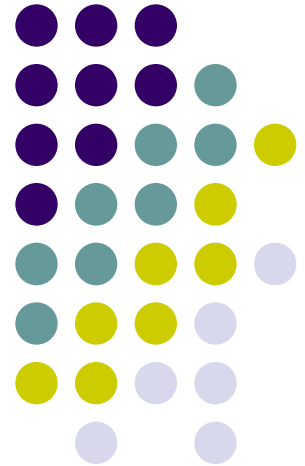

What is a Credit?

- Credit is earned when you pass all, or part of a class.
 - Credits are earning in 0.25 increments per marking period.
 - Full year courses = 1.0 credits
 - Half year course = 0.50 credits
- Every school determines how many credits you need in order to graduate
- How many credits are needed to graduate from CSL?

Credit Requirements

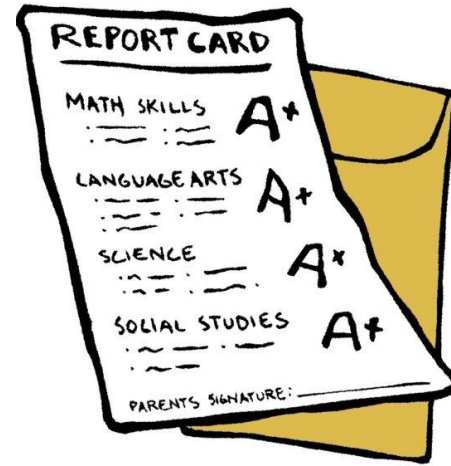


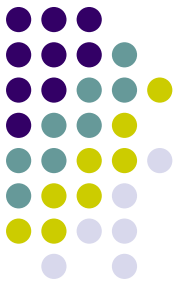
Course	Credits
Math	4.00
English LA	4.00
Science	4.00
Social Studies	4.00
Health & PE	1.50
Arts & Humanities	2.00
Electives	4.50
TOTAL	24.00 *

* = plus successful completion of Graduation Project

Staying on Track

- End of **Freshman Year**
 - 6 CREDITS
- End of **Sophomore Year**
 - 12 CREDITS
- End of **Junior Year**
 - 18 CREDITS
- End of **Senior Year/Graduation!**
 - 24 CREDITS





Averaging Grading Policy

Example 1:

Quarter 1: 89% PASS

Quarter 2: 52% FAIL

Quarter 3: 94% PASS

Quarter 4: 90% PASS

Yearly Class Average: 81% B- Credits Earned: 1.0 credit - NO credit recovery needed

Example 2:

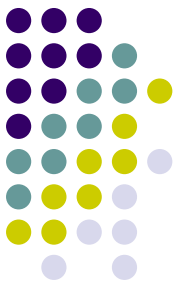
Quarter 1: 89% PASS

Quarter 2: 52% FAIL

Quarter 3: 50% FAIL

Quarter 4: 90% PASS

Yearly Class Average: 70% C- Credits Earned: 0.50 credits - NEED credit recovery

What is a transcript?

- A list of the:
 - schools you have attended
 - courses you have taken
 - credits you have earned
 - average score of marking period grades
 - grade point average (GPA)
 - Keystone Exam scores
 - plus any other graduation requirements

Transcripts are very important when pursuing continuing education!

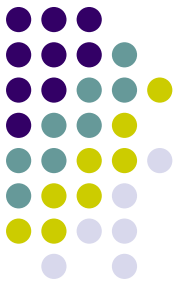


How is GPA calculated?

GRADE POINT AVERAGE: GPA is calculated by using grades earned in all courses. Passing grades of Pass/Fail are not included in GPA, however failure of a Pass/Fail course is included. Grade point average will be reported on student transcripts. The scale is as follows:

A+	4.00	C	2.00
A	3.88	C-	1.67
A-	3.67	C+	2.33
B	3.00	D	1.00
B-	2.67	D-	0.67
B+	3.33	D+	1.33
F	0.00		

Importance of Attendance



What is TRUANCY?

- A student is considered *truant* once they after they have accumulated **3 unexcused** absences

- A student is considered *habitually truant* once they after they have accumulated
- **6 unexcused** absences

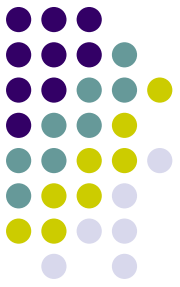

Importance of Attendance

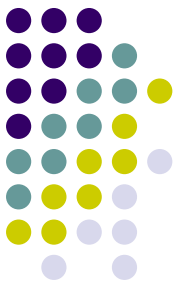


- Permitted **12 *parent excusals*** per year (3 per marking period).
- Notes/Emails/Phone Calls for excusing an absence must be made **within 3 days** from the day you were out.
- Doctor's notes are always acceptable and unlimited.

Failures Due to Attendance Policy (FAs)



- **5 or more Unexcused Absences** from school and/or a class will result in an 'Incomplete' on your report card
- Time must be made up after school during AEP with Mr. Whelan in order to earn back your grade. *However, if you need to make up more than **10 Unexcused Absences**; AEP will **NOT** be an option and will result in automatic failure at 40%*
- Failure to make up the time, results in an 'Incomplete' becoming an FA = 40%
